A new line-placing device which is claimed to eliminate problems like snagging, wrapping, jamming and dead stops has been invented by a Canadian arborist.

The [Treepedo](#), launched by King Tree Service owner Thomas Amorim, aims to improve rope placement by offering better flight and provide a lead-free alternative to throw bags.

It was introduced to UK customers at the Arborists' Trade Fair last month where it was well received.

Amorim is seeking a UK distributor for the Treepedo, which he claims is vital for the environment to reduce the amount of toxic lead released by throw bags.
